THE TISZA

The Tisza is the longest tributary of the Duna, the Black and White Tisza arises from the confluence of the Tisza.



It passes through Hungary, Romania, Slovakia,
Ukraine and Serbia.



The Tisza catchment area of approximately 157,000 km², its water level fluctuates.

The Tisza is 597 km long in Hungary.



(The Tisza was 1419 km long many years ago.)

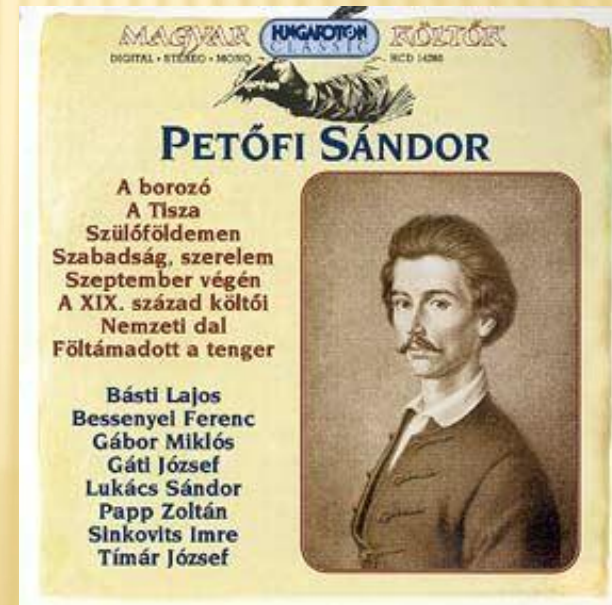
The Tisza flows through the Great Plain which is the largest plain in Central Europe and like all plains the Great Plain also slows down the rivers.

The Upper Tisza is between Tokaj and the border,
the Middle Tisza is between Tokaj and the
Tiszaug,
the Lower Tisza is between the Tiszaug and the
south of the border.

The Hungarians are the most strongly bound to the Tisza. This suggests that the Tisza is the most celebrated in the poems and folk songs.
