

Water ACDC (Active Concern for Dynamic Change) is a multilateral mobility programme with schools from Finland, Hungary, Iceland, Turkey and Slovakia working on the topic of how best to utilise our water supply and investigating the harmful effects of misuse and mismanagement. First a common social network site was opened by the coordinator where students and teachers involved in the project could easily and quickly exchange general information, upload pictures, choose who to host during the mobility week through multiple communication with many different students, exchange ideas concerning the project and upload their completed products. Then, the students (with teacher coordination) prepared power point presentations in their own institutions in three major categories which were later split up into multiple sub-categories. These were: 1. Introduction of town and country; 2. Introduction of their schools; 3. Water. The topic of water was split up into 5 categories and a different one was concentrated on and presented during the 5 mobility weeks. These categories were: Water and the environment, geographically and geologically; the effects of water in culture; water in sport and the different forms of water; water in free-time and science; and the power of water. These presentations were generally power point presentations, but some schools chose to have an interactive presentation, used films, whilst others did their presentations using the latest software like "prezi". The presentations were then presented by the hosting and visiting students during the mobility weeks. At this time, the hosting school organized activities connected to the topic of water that was to be concentrated upon in their country. At the end of the 5 mobilities the members involved had an evaluation meeting in Slovakia (during the last mobility week). A progress meeting was also held in Turkey after (during) the second mobility.
